AGENDA TOPIC

Discussion of Reno County Fire District 3 recommendation to replace a fire 1996 fire

brush truck with a new brush truck

## SUMMARY & BACKGROUND OF TOPIC

Currently Reno County Fire District 3 (D3) has a 1996 Chevrolet one-ton single rear wheel brush truck. To keep on track with D3's capital this vehicle should be replaced in 2021. D3 has secured a quote for a new 5500 cab and chassis from Allen Samuels for a cost of \$44,950. D3 has also secured a quote from Emergency Fire Equipment for \$83,175.28 to complete the brush truck to the desired specifications. The total cost of this vehicle would not exceed \$130,000. The 1996 brush truck that is due to be replaced is still in good mechanical condition and could be made available to be purchased by another Reno County fire district

## **ALL OPTIONS**

- 1) Purchase a new 2021 Ram 5500 from Allen Samuels for a cost of \$44,950, Contract with Emergency Fire Equipment to build and outfit the truck for a total cost not to exceed \$130,000. and allow the 1996 brush truck to be purchased by another Reno County fire district.
- 2) Purchase a new 2021 Ram 5500 from Allen Samuels for a cost of \$44,950, Contract with Emergency Fire Equipment to build and outfit the truck for a total cost not to exceed \$130,000. And allow the 1996 brush truck to be sold on Purple Wave.
- 3) Bid and purchase a new 2021 model year completely outfitted trucks that meet specifications set forth by D3.
- 4) Go to bid on new cab and chassis and building of new brush truck
- 5) Attempt to find a used brush truck that would serve the needs of D3.
- 6) Continue using the current fire vehicles.

## RECOMMENDATION/REQUEST

Alternative #1 – When purchasing a large brush truck new, it will come with a warranty and be built to the specifications of D3. The new truck will be built with the newest technology that will help keep the firefighters safer. By allowing another fire district to purchase the 1996 brush truck at an agreed upon price, it would improve county fire fighting capabilities.

POLICY / FISCAL IMPACT\

Revised: 03/10/2021

There is funding in the District's Special Equipment fund to cover the cost of a replacement vehicle without having any short or long-term negative impact on planned projects. This is a planned expenditure in their capital outlay.

## Reno County Fire District 3 Proposed Brush Truck Replacement

In keeping with the Fire District 3 Capital Improvement Plan, it is time to replace our 1996 Chevrolet brush truck, identified as 392. Since 2008, Fire District 3 has been gradually upgrading our brush trucks to take advantage of newer technologies, provide a safer platform for our personnel to work from, and better meet the needs of our citizens by improving our firefighting capabilities.

392 is a one-ton single-wheel pickup with a slip-in firefighting package bolted in the bed. The slip-in has a water capacity of 300 gallons and has foam capabilities. It lacks proper storage for loose equipment, and when staffed by firefighters is over is rated weight capacity.

While we use the term brush trucks, these apparatus have evolved to provide us with additional capabilities on a variety of emergency incidents. Our newer brush trucks have increase water capacity, have front bumper mounted nozzles to allow safer firefighting in certain conditions, adjustable scene lighting to provide for a safer work area, more storage capacity for loose equipment, and improved emergency lighting to increase visibility and help reduce the chance of collisions. This is particularly important when operating on or near roadways in limited visibility conditions. Since 2008, we have been using a heavier truck chassis to better carry the weight of personnel and firefighting equipment. This allows for increased safety by not pushing the limits of the vehicle steering, suspension and brakes.

According to our Capital Improvement Plan, \$125,000 was budgeted for the replacement of 392 during 2021. Supply chain issues during the pandemic has made pricing a replacement truck challenging. Vendors and manufacturers are hesitant to quote prices and state delivery dates because of the many variables in today's market.

Fire District 3 has secured a quote for a complete brush truck meeting our needs, minus the truck chassis. The quote from Emergency Fire Equipment is for \$83,175.28. The fire package is in line with the brush trucks purchased since 2008, with some improvements, mainly from advances in technology or materials used. While determining what worked well and word could be improved upon from our previous brush trucks, notable changes are increasing water capacity by 50 gallons, adding "sweep nozzles" under the side and front of the truck, to better protect the truck from heat damage, additional storage space, and the addition of a central console in the cab that will give the driver the ability to monitor and adjust pump settings, monitor water level, and operate the "sweep nozzles" and bumper nozzles from inside the cab.


The quote did not include the price of the chassis, because they were not comfortable they could order and provide a suitable chassis in a reasonable amount of time. I contacted Allen Samuels Chrysler Dodge Jeep Ram to see what options we had for


obtaining a chassis. While there was uncertainty on the availability of a 2022 chassis and government pricing, they were able to find a suitable 2021 chassis that has already been built and sitting on a dealer lot. This chassis is the desired color and equipped almost exactly as we would have specified if we were ordering new. The chassis lists for \$49,950, and Allen Samuels stated they could deliver it to us for a price of \$44,950.

When adding fire package quote of \$83,175.28 and the chassis quote of \$44,950, this brings the total to \$128,125. 28. This is slightly over our budgeted amount of \$125,000, but I consider it a very good deal in today's market. There are sufficient funds in the Fire District 3 Capital Improvement Fund to cover the additional amount, with no long-term consequences on future plans.

Reno County Fire District 3 requests the approval to purchase the 2021 Ram 5500 chassis from Allen Samuels for a price of \$44,950, and also approval to proceed with the construction of the fire package as quoted by Emergency Fire Equipment.

Copies of the window sticker for the proposed chassis, the quote and design drawing s for the fire package, and a copy of the Fire District 3 Capital Improvement Plan are attached to this document.


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



**AGENDA TOPIC** Discussion of Reno County Fire District 6 recommendation to replace a fire 1985 fire

pumper truck with a used 2000 Central States pumper truck.

## SUMMARY & BACKGROUND OF TOPIC

Currently Reno County Fire District 6 (D6) has a 1985 Pierce pumper. This truck is mechanically unable to pass a pump test and has other mechanical issues. The cost to repair the truck and get it to the point to pass a pump test will exceed the value of the apparatus. D6 has located two used pumper trucks that are for sale in Rice County that would meet their required specifications. The total cost to purchase one used pumper truck from Rice County will not exceed \$45,000. This used pumper would be a big upgrade compared to what is currently in service and would be used for several years.

#### **ALL OPTIONS**

- 1) Purchase a used pumper truck from Rice County for a total cost not to exceed \$45,000 and allow the sale of the 1985 Pierce Pumper on Purple Wave.
- 2) Attempt to find another used pumper truck to meet D6's needs.
- 3) Continue using the current fire vehicles.

## RECOMMENDATION/REQUEST

Alternative #1 – By purchasing a used pumper truck, it will improve the capabilities of the fire district. Since the used trucks are located in Rice County, an inspection has been done and they are in good working order. These will serve the citizens of D6 for several years.

## Reno County Fire District 6 Replacement Pumper Proposal

Reno County Fire District 6 currently has a 1985 Pierce pumper that has not been able to pass it's annual pump test. This pumper was recently scheduled for diagnosis and possible repair with Weis Fire & Rescue in Salina. While driving the pumper to Salina, it overheated at Geneseo and was not able to complete the drive. Autohouse Towing was called to pick up the pumper and deliver it to Weis Fire & Safety, which it did without incident.

A few days after the pumper's arrival in Salina, the service technician from Weis contacted me to let us know that they had found a bad hose, replaced it, and filled the cooling system with antifreeze. He reported that he then attempted to run diagnostic tests on the pumper, and that it had overheated again within 5 minutes of beginning the tests. Weis Fire does not work on pumper engines, so he recommended it sent to a local repair shop to fix the overheating issue. Permission was given to proceed.

About a week and a half later, the service technician from Weis contacted me to let know that they had received the pumper back from the repair shop and had done some initial testing. He wanted to know how far we wanted to go with repairing this truck. The total of the tow bill, engine repair, and testing they had done so far was \$4,700.00. Unfortunately, his initial testing indicated that the pumper would likely need a complete pump overhaul, and that repair could easily be in excess of \$15,000.00. He cautioned against this, because during the last round of testing he also believed that the engine showed signs of having additional issues that would need to be dealt with, even after overhauling the pump. At this point, the estimated repairs would easily exceed the value of the pumper. Weis Fire was advised to stop with repairs.

A search was then initiated to identify a suitable used replacement pumper, that would meet the district needs and also fit within existing budget constraints. I was able to locate two suitable pumpers in Rice County. Both trucks are 2000 Central States pumpers on a Freightliner chassis. One truck has just over 16,000 miles and is priced at \$35,000. The other truck has just over 25,000 miles and is priced at \$45,000. The truck with higher miles is priced higher because it is slightly better cosmetically.

The pumper listed for \$35,000 would meet the needs of the fire district, and better fits within the budget. Pictures and specifications for this truck are attached. It is my recommendation that we move forward with the purchase of this pumper.

After personally inspecting this pumper, I would say it is in very good condition. Being 21 years old, it is not perfect, but is much better condition than many pumpers that age. All body compartment doors open and close as designed. The compartments, and

the exterior body panels are in good condition show little wear for its age. The engine starts easily and runs smoothly, with no issues noted in the rest of the drivetrain.

Purchasing this pumper would allow Fire District 6 to once again respond to a variety of emergency situations they are unable to at this time. This would include structure fires, vehicle fires, motor-vehicle accidents, farm accidents, and several others. Restoring this response capability would substantially reduce current response times by eliminating the requirement of mutual aid into the district, as well as add another good-quality apparatus to support other districts in the western part of the county.

Attached is a copy of the pumper specifications, as listed on the website, as well as additional pictures of the pumper. The final page is an adjusted Capital Improvement Plan for Fire District 6. By updating apparatus replacement priorities and using reasonable price projections for finding more quality used apparatus, I believe Fire District 6 can gradually improve the overall quality of its fleet, while maintaining a positive balance in the capital improvement fund.

NOTE: The pumper being offered for \$45,000 was mentioned above because since both apparatus are currently being advertised, our desired pumper may be sold before a formal presentation can be made. If our target pumper has been sold prior to the August 24, 2021 commission meeting, I would recommend moving forward with the higher priced pumper. I also personally inspected it and believe it is in even better condition than the lower-priced pumper.

## **SUMMARY & BACKGROUND OF TOPIC:**

The KWORCC Board of Trustees is comprised of seven persons, each of whom is an elected official. Only one elected official designated by that county's Board of Commissioners may sit on the Board of Trustees to represent the county. One Trustee will be elected from each of the six regional districts and one Trustee will be elected at large. Trustees on the Board will be elected by all voting representatives at the annual meeting held on October 18, 2021.

The following KWORCC Trustees are seeking re-election to the KWORCC Board of Trustees: Rob Roberts, Miami County Commission, Southeast District; Gary Caspers, Cloud County Commissioner, North Central District; Wayne Wilt, Cowley County Commissioner, South Central District and Stan McEvoy, Decatur County Commissioner, Northwest District.
