AGENDA TOPIC:

Per KDOT policy on Selling Released Transit Vehicles, acknowledge KDOT's determination that 3 Rcat cutaway buses, a 2014 FORD Eldorado Areotech VIN1FD4E4FS2DDB30741 with 1388,889 miles, a 2013 FORD Eldorado Areotech VIN 1FD4E4FS3DDA59551 with 222,679 miles and a 2018 FORD Eldorado Advantage VIN 1FD4E4FS8HDC72078 with 190,457 miles will transfer to another agency in need and authorize County Administrator Randy Partington to sign the titles

SUMMARY & BACKGROUND OF TOPIC:

According to the August 2023 KDOT Policy Manual from the office of Public Transportation and Bureau of Multimodal Transportation; **Vehicle Retirement/Transfer to Another Agency** Agencies that have vehicles that need to be retired must follow the KDOT procedure for retiring them. The retirement of vehicles is based on age and mileage. The Federal Transit Administration depreciation rate will be used when a vehicle is being retired. If a vehicle has been requested for retirement or lien release, then it may be transferred instead to another transit agency at KDOT discretion. The agency that accepts the transferred vehicle will be responsible to pay the agency that is transferring the vehicle 20% of the current value of the vehicle.
